





Psalm 73

Quam bonus Israel!



- 1 Truly, God is good to Israel,* to those who are pure in heart.
- 2 But as for me, my feet had nearly **slipped**;* I had almost **tripped** and **fallen**;
- 3 Because I envied the **proud*** and saw the prosperity **of** the **wick**ed:
- 4 For they suffer no **pain**,* and their bo**dies** are **sleek** and sound;
- 5 In the misfortunes of others they have no **share**;* they are not afflicted as others are;
- 6 Therefore they wear their pride like a **neck**lace* and wrap their violence about them like a cloak.
- 7 Their iniquity comes from gross **minds**,* and their hearts over**flow** with **wick**ed thoughts.
- 8 They scoff and speak maliciously;* out of their haughtiness they **plan** op**pres**sion.
- 9 They set their mouths against the **heavens**,* and their evil **speech** runs **through** the world.
- 10 And so the people turn to **them*** and **find** in **them** no fault.
- 11 They say, "How should God know?* is there knowledge in the Most High?"
- 12 So then, these are the **wick**ed;* always at ease, **they** in**crease** their wealth.
- 13 In vain have I kept my **heart** clean,* and washed my **hands** in **in**nocence.
- 14 I have been afflicted all day **long**,* and punished **every morn**ing.
- 15 Had I gone on speaking this way,*I should have betrayed the generation of your children.



- 16 When I tried to understand these things,* it was too hard for me;
- 17 Until I entered the sanctuary of **God*** and discerned the end **of** the **wick**ed.
- 18 Surely, you set them in slippery **places**;* you cast them **down** in **ru**in.
- 19 Oh, how suddenly do they come to destruction,* come to an end, and perish from terror!
- 20 Like a dream when one awakens, O Lord,* when you arise you will make their image vanish.
- 21 When my mind became embittered,* I was sorely **woun**ded **in** my heart.
- 22 I was stupid and had no understanding;* I was like a brute beast in your presence.
- 23 Yet I am always with **you**;* you hold **me** by **my** right hand.
- 24 You will guide me by your **counsel**,* and afterwards receive **me** with **glory**.
- 25 Whom have I in heaven but **you**?* and having you I desire nothing upon earth.
- 26 Though my flesh and my heart should **waste** away,* God is the strength of my heart and my por**tion** for **ever**.
- 27 Truly, those who forsake you will **per**ish;* you destroy all who **are** un**faith**ful.
- 28 But it is good for me to be **near** God;* I have made the Lord **God** my **re**fuge.
- 29 I will speak of all your **works*** in the gates of the city of Zion.



- 1 O God, why have you utterly **cast** us **off**?* why is your wrath so hot against the **sheep** of your **pasture**?
- 2 Remember your congregation that you purchased long ago,* the tribe you redeemed to be your inheritance, and Mount Zion where you dwell.
- 3 Turn your steps toward the endless ruins;* the enemy has laid waste everything in your sanctuary.
- 4 Your adversaries roared in your **ho**ly **place**;* they set up their banners as **to**kens of **vic**to*ry*.
- 5 They were like men coming up with axes to a **grove** of **trees**;* they broke down all your carved work with **hat**chets and **ham**mers.
- 6 They set fire to your holy place;* they defiled the dwelling-place of your Name and razed it to the ground.
- 7 They said to themselves, "Let us destroy them **altogether**."* They burned down all the meeting-places of God in the *land*.
- 8 There are no signs for us to see; there is no **pro**phet **left**;* there is not one among **us** who knows **how** *long*.
- 9 How long, O God, will the adversary scoff?* will the enemy blaspheme your Name for ever?
- 10 Why do you draw back your hand?* why is your right hand hidden in your bosom?
- 11 Yet God is my King from **an**cient **times**,* victorious **in** the midst **of** the *earth*.
- 12 You divided the sea by your might* and shattered the heads of dragons upon the waters;
- 13 You crushed the heads of Leviathan* and gave him to the people of the desert for *food*.
- 14 You split open **spring** and **tor**rent;* you dried up ever-flowing rivers.



- 15 Yours is the day, yours also the night;* you established the moon and the sun.
- 16 You fixed all the boundaries of the earth;* you made both summer and winter.
- 17 Remember, O LORD, how the enemy scoffed,* how a foolish people despised your *Name*.
- 18 Do not hand over the life of your dove to wild beasts;* never forget the lives of your poor.
- 19 Look upon your covenant;* the dark places of the earth are haunts of violence.
- 20 Let not the oppressed turn away ashamed;* let the poor and needy praise your *Name*.
- 21 Arise, O God, maintain your cause;* remember how fools revile you all day *long*.
- 22 Forget not the clamor of your **adversa**ries, the unending tumult of those who **rise** up against *you*.
 - Glory to the Father, and to the Son,* and to the Holy Spirit:
 - As it was in the beginning, is now,* and will be for ever. Amen.

The First Lesson, Judges 16:15-31

Revised Standard Version

Deli'lah said to Samson, "How can you say, 'I love you,' when your heart is not with me? You have mocked me these three times, and you have not told me wherein your great strength lies." And when she pressed him hard with her words day after day, and urged him, his soul was vexed to death. And he told her all his mind, and said to her, "A razor has never come upon my head; for I have been a Nazirite to God from my mother's womb. If I be shaved, then my strength will leave me, and I shall become weak, and be like any other man." When Deli'lah saw that he had told her all his mind, she sent and called the lords of the Philistines, saying, "Come up this once, for he has told me all his mind." Then the lords of the Philistines came up to her, and brought the money in their hands. She made him sleep upon her knees;

and she called a man, and had him shave off the seven locks of his head. Then she began to torment him, and his strength left him. And she said, "The Philistines are upon you, Samson!" And he awoke from his sleep, and said, "I will go out as at other times, and shake myself free." And he did not know that the LORD had left him. And the Philistines seized him and gouged out his eyes, and brought him down to Gaza, and bound him with bronze fetters; and he ground at the mill in the prison. But the hair of his head began to grow again after it had been shaved. Now the lords of the Philistines gathered to offer a great sacrifice to Dagon their god, and to rejoice; for they said, "Our god has given Samson our enemy into our hand." And when the people saw him, they praised their god; for they said, "Our god has given our enemy into our hand, the ravager of our country, who has slain many of us." And when their hearts were merry, they said, "Call Samson, that he may make sport for us." So they called Samson out of the prison, and he made sport before them. They made him stand between the pillars; and Samson said to the lad who held him by the hand, "Let me feel the pillars on which the house rests, that I may lean against them." Now the house was full of men and women; all the lords of the Philistines were there, and on the roof there were about three thousand men and women, who looked on while Samson made sport. Then Samson called to the LORD and said, "O Lord GOD, remember me, I pray thee, and strengthen me, I pray thee, only this once, O God, that I may be avenged upon the Philistines for one of my two eyes." And Samson grasped the two middle pillars upon which the house rested, and he leaned his weight upon them, his right hand on the one and his left hand on the other. And Samson said, "Let me die with the Philistines." Then he bowed with all his might; and the house fell upon the lords and upon all the people that were in it. So the dead whom he slew at his death were more than those whom he had slain during his life. Then his brothers and all his family came down and took him and brought him up and buried him between Zorah and Esh'ta-ol in the tomb of Mano'ah his father. He had judged Israel twenty years.


The Second Lesson, Mark 5:25-34 (sit)


The Apostles' Creed (sung on tone) Officiant I believe in God,
