


Capital Campaign Celebration - Last chance to RSVP!



Wednesday Night Adult Education: An Uncertain Boundary

Join parishioner **Larry Story** on Wednesday evenings this August for <u>An Uncertain Boundary: Tracing the Line Between "Church" and "State,"</u> an historical examination of the interaction between Church and State from the Roman Empire to the First Amendment.

Larry Story is Associate Professor of History at Tarrant County College (TCC)-South Campus. He has been teaching both sections of United States History and Western Civilization since the school opened as Tarrant County Junior College in 1967. This fall he will begin his 59th year at TCC. He is the only founding faculty member still teaching at TCC.

Christian Education for Children and Youth 2025-2026

Godly Play

What: Children enter into parables, silence, sacred stories, and liturgy in order to discover God, and the world around them. Godly Play

assumes that children have some experience of the mystery of the presence of God in their lives, but lack the language, permission, and understanding to express and enjoy that in our culture. The teachers tell stories and ask "I wonder..." questions meant to guide the children on their spiritual journey and help them fall more deeply in love with God.



Who: Ages 3 – 3rd Grade

Where: Ages 3-6 in the chapel classroom; grades 1-3 in the atrium

When: Sunday mornings 10:10 a.m. - 11:05 a.m.

Godly Talk / Pre EYC

What: Utilizing the very best of the Montessori method, Godly Talk students step into new and complex sacred stories, take on responsibilities serving God and his Church, and build Christian community. Teachers guide students from wondering questions into open-ended discussions. In this class, students learn through games, in wonder, and from one another. This age group also enjoys two activities per month on Sunday afternoons: one fun event and one service project. This Pre-EYC time helps the children build friendships which will sustain them into their adolescence.

Who: 4th-5th Grade

Where: Pop-up classroom in the 6th grade commons

month from 12:30 p.m. – 1:30 p.m.

Jr. EYC (Sunday School and Youth Group)

What: This curriculum guides students through their Middle School years. Engaging with Holy Scripture, the Prayer Book, and our tradition, students develop their identity as Christians, Episcopalians, and servant leaders. The evening sessions begin with a meal and focus on fun, service, and building community.

For those who qualify, this class culminates with a local, lock-in mission trip.

Who: 6th-8th Grade

Where: Student Union Classroom

When: Sunday mornings 10:10 a.m. to 11:05 a.m. AND 5:45 p.m.

- 7:45 p.m. (immediately following Solemn Evensong)

Sr. EYC / Confirmation Class (Sunday School and Youth Group)

What: This question-based course guides teens as they transition from a childlike faith to an adult faith. Exploring the core tenets of our identity as Christians, Episcopalians, and as Anglicans, they will prepare for their adult proclamation of faith at their Confirmation in

2024. In this course, youth are not given easy, pat answers. Instead, adult leaders guide teens in conversation about the complexities of scripture, community, and a life of faith. The evening sessions begin with a meal and focus on fun, service, and building community.


For those confirmands who qualify, this class culminates with a Pilgrimage to Canterbury in July of 2026.


Upcoming at All Saints'



Special Adult Forum: Belize Mission Trip


