





Psalm 65

Te decet hymnus

John Randall



John Randall (1716-1799) was an English organist and academic. He worked at the University of Cambridge, first as the organist of King's College, and later as Professor of Music. The memorial where he is buried in Cambridge has the inscription *The sweetness of his harmonies charmed the ear, and the mildness of his manners the heart.*

- 1 You are to be praised O / God in / Zion; * to you shall / vows be per / formed in Je / rusalem.
- 2 To you that hear prayer shall / all flesh / come, * be / cause of / their trans / gressions.
- 3 Our sins are / stronger than / we are, * but / you will / blot them / out.
- 4 Happy are they whom you choose and draw to your / courts to / dwell there! * they will be satisfied by the beauty of your house, by the / holiness / of your / temple.
- 5 Awesome things will you show us in your righteousness, O God of / our sal / vation, * O Hope of all the ends of the earth and of the / seas that are / far a / way.
- 6 You make fast the / mountains by your / power; * they are / girded a / bout with / might.
- 7 You still the / <u>roaring of the</u> / seas, * the roaring of their waves and the / clamor / of the / peoples.
- 8 Those who dwell at the ends of the earth will tremble at your / <u>marve</u>lous / signs; * you make the dawn and the / dusk to / sing for / joy.
- 9 You visit the earth and water it abundantly; you make it / very / plenteous; * the river of / God is / full of / water.
- 10 You pre / pare the / grain, * for / so you pro / vide for the / earth.
- 11 You drench the furrows and smooth / out the / ridges; * with heavy rain you soften the / ground and / bless its / increase.
- 12 You crown the / year with your / goodness, * and your paths / over / flow with / plenty.
- 13 May the fields of the wilderness be / rich for / grazing, * and the / hills be / clothed with / joy.
- 14 May the meadows cover themselves with flocks, and the valleys cloak them / selves with / grain; * let them / shout for / joy and / sing.

Psalm 66 Jubilate Deo John Jones



Anglican chant composed by John Jones (1728-1796), who was a boy chorister at St. Paul's Cathedral in London, and later the Organist of the Temple Church, the Charterhouse, and St. Paul's Cathedral.

- 1 Be joyful in / God <u>all you</u> / lands; * sing the glory of his Name; sing the / glory / of his / praise.
- 2 Say to God "How / <u>awesome are your</u> / deeds! * because of your great strength your / enemies / cringe be / fore you.
- 3 All the earth bows / down be / fore you, * sings to / you sings / out your / Name."
- 4 Come now and see the / works of / God, * how wonderful he is in his / doing / toward all / people.
- 5 He turned the sea into dry land, so that they went through the / water on / foot, * and / there / we re / joiced in him.
- 6 In his might he rules for ever; his eyes keep watch / <u>over</u> the / nations; * let no / <u>rebel</u> rise / up a / gainst him.
- 7 Bless our / God you / peoples; * make the / voice of his / praise to be / heard;
- 8 Who holds our / souls in / life, * and will not al / low our / feet to / slip.
- 9 For you O / God have / proved us; * you have tried us / just as / <u>silver</u> is / tried.
- 10 You brought us / <u>into</u> the / snare; * you laid heavy / <u>burdens</u> up / on our / backs.
- 11 You let enemies ride over our heads; we went through / fire and / water; * but you brought us out / into a / place of re / freshment.
- 12 I will enter your house with burnt-offerings and will / <u>pay you</u> my / vows, * which I promised with my lips and spoke with my / mouth when I / was in / trouble.
- 13 I will offer you sacrifices of fat beasts with the / smoke of / rams; * I will / give you / oxen and / goats.
- 14 Come and listen all / you who fear / God, * and I will / tell you / what he has / done for me.
- 15 I called out to / <u>him with</u> my / mouth, * and his / praise was / on my / tongue.
- 16 If I had found / evil in my / heart, * the / Lord would / not have / heard me;
- 17 But in truth / God has / heard me; * he has attended to the / **voice** / of my / prayer.
- 18 Blessed be God who has not re / <u>jected</u> my / prayer, * nor with / held his / love from / me.

Frederick A. Gore Ouseley



Anglican chant composed by Sir Frederick Arthur Gore Ouseley (1825-1889), an English organist and priest. He founded St. Michael's College (near Worcester), a choir school intended to serve as a model for Anglican church music.

The LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind: "Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? Gird up your loins like a man, I will question you, and you shall declare to me. Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone, when the morning stars sang together, and all the sons of God shouted for joy? Or who shut in the sea with doors, when it burst forth from the womb; when I made clouds its garment, and thick darkness its swaddling band, and prescribed bounds for it, and set bars and doors, and said, 'Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stayed'?" Then Job answered the LORD: "I know that thou canst do all things, and that no purpose of thine can be thwarted. 'Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?' Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know. 'Hear,

and I will speak; I will question you, and you declare to me.' I had heard of thee by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees thee."

Music composed by Sir George Dyson (1883-1964), Director of the Royal College of Music in London. Dyson said of himself as a composer, "My reputation is that of a good technician ... not markedly original. I am familiar with modern idioms but they are outside the vocabulary of what I want to say".




