#### All Saints' Sunday Our 80<sup>th</sup> Patronal Feast

All Saints' Sunday was celebrated at All Saints' Episcopal Church on **November 2**. One combined Holy Eucharist brought together parishioners from both the 9:00 a.m. and the 11:15 a.m. services, Baptismal candidates and first Communicants, their families, and many others. The All Saints' School Chapel was filled with worshippers! **Rick Grimes**, long-time Organist and Choirmaster, now retired, was back behind the keyboard. As he began the first familiar notes of "For All the Saints," the congregation rose to sing the favorite hymn with fervor. Together with the All Saints' Choir, Brass Quintet, and Timpanist, it was a joyful start to the day.



All Saints' Sunday is always a time for celebration here at All Saints', but this year it was extra special. All Saints' Sunday 2025 marked the 80th Patronal Feast for our parish. In other words, it was All Saints' Episcopal Church's 80th anniversary! During the service, **The Rev. M. Madeleine Hill** delivered a beautiful sermon in which she included examples of saints from All Saints' early years. Many of those early parishioners, like Ed and Henrietta Ferree, have children and relatives who are still active at All Saints' today. It was a lovely way to weave the beginning and the current history of our parish together.

Although it was a morning of celebration, it was also a bittersweet time. All Saints' Sunday marked Mthr. Hill's last Sunday at All Saints'. She was first known to us as Maddie, a teenager who grew up in the pews of our congregation. Later, she would go on to became Mthr. Maddie Hill, a beloved member of the clergy and our Priest-in-Charge for almost two years. She is currently discerning her next call, and will no doubt bless another parish as she has All Saints'. During the announcements, Vestry member **Dr. Trace Worrell** paid tribute to Mthr. Hill and thanked her for her many contributions to All Saints'.

Following the service, everyone processed to the Student Union for a delicious lunch of fried chicken with all the fixings, provided by the Parish Life Commission. **Jerra Lewis** finished off the meal with her famous homemade dessert trifles. Afterward, Mthr. Hill was presented with letters, cards and notes written by parishioners, as well as a "travel fund." A beautiful Waterford cross and engraved silver tray were also given, and the youth of the parish signed and gave her a copy of the Dr. Seuss classic, "Oh, The Places You'll Go."

As the morning concluded, it was hard not to feel thankful. Thankful for the saints who had come before us, thankful for the ministry of Mthr. Hill, and thankful for All Saints' Episcopal Church.

## Change is Good... You Go First!

Change is hard, especially when it is unexpected and painful. Our reaction is often laden with conflicting feelings and a tendency to blame and shame. Loss is painful, no matter why it happens. Grief is a healthy and natural response to loss. By naming the loss, the pain, the feelings, we validate our experience. When we are heard without judgment the affirmation of our right to our experience opens the way to healing. Healing comes as we lament, share, mutually support each other, and turn toward resurrection hope.

#### Some suggestions:

- Cultivate your love of God by practicing deep listening to God that we call centering prayer. This will be offered at the Advent Retreat November 21.
- Cultivate your self love by naming/expressing your feelings all of them. If you choose to share with another, use "I" statements to keep it true to you without blaming others or imposing your experience on others.
- Cultivate your love of others by listening to their experiences without judgment.
- Write down all the fears and hurts that surface. Place the list in a safe container give them to God. One in, to peaking. Add another, or repeat as needed.
- Write down all your uncertainties and unanswered questions. Place them in their own container and give them to God.
- Write down your hopes and post them on the mirror.

In due time, when things seem to have settled, open the box of fears and hurts, the box of uncertainties, and then compare them to your hopes. See how God has transformed them, and you.
