Anglican chant composed by Sir Edward Elgar (1857-1934), who was appointed *Master of the King's Musick* in 1924. Among his best-known compositions are the *Enigma Variations*, the *Pomp and Circumstance Marches*, and the *Dream of Gerontius*.

Anglican chant composed by Samuel Sebastian Wesley (1810-1876), Organist of many different churches – including Winchester, Gloucester, Exeter and Hereford Cathedrals – during his career. He composed the music for *The Church's one foundation*, Hymn #525.

Anglican chant composed by Sir Frederick Arthur Gore Ouseley (1825-1889), an English organist and priest. He founded St. Michael's College (near Worcester), a choir school intended to serve as a model for Anglican church music.

Edwin George Monk



Anglican chant composed by Edwin George Monk (1819-1900), an English church organist and composer. He was the Organist and Master of the Choristers at York Minster for a quarter of a century, and was previously associated with St Columba's and Radley Colleges.

The First Lesson, Job 28:12-28

Revised Standard Version

Again Job took up his discourse, and said, "But where shall wisdom be found? And where is the place of understanding? Man does not know the way to it, and it is not found in the land of the living. The deep says, 'It is not in me,' and the sea says, 'It is not with me.' It cannot be gotten for gold, and silver cannot be weighed as its price. It cannot be valued in the gold of Ophir, in precious onyx or sapphire. Gold and glass cannot equal it, nor can it be exchanged for jewels of fine gold. No mention shall be made of coral or of crystal; the price of wisdom is above pearls. The topaz of Ethiopia cannot compare with it, nor can it be valued in pure gold. Whence then comes wisdom? And where is the place of understanding? It is hid from the eyes of all living, and concealed from the birds of the air. Abaddon and Death say, 'We have heard a rumor of it with our ears.' God understands the way to it, and he knows its place. For he looks to the ends of the earth, and sees everything under the heavens. When he gave to the wind its weight, and meted out the waters by measure; when he made a decree for the rain, and a way for the lightning of the thunder; then he saw it and declared it; he established it, and searched it out. And he said to man, 'Behold, the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom; and to depart from evil is understanding.'"

Edward Bunnett (1834-1923) was an English organist and composer. He spent most of his life in the county of Norfolk: he was born in the village of Shipdam, and he worked as an organist in the city of Norwich – first at Norwich Cathedral, and later at the parish church of St Peter Mancroft.

Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net which was thrown into the sea and gathered fish of every kind; when it was full, men drew it ashore and sat down and sorted the good into vessels but threw away the bad. So it will be at the close of the age. The angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous, and throw them into the furnace of fire; there men will weep and gnash their teeth. Have you understood all this?” They said to him, “Yes.” And he said to them, “Therefore every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like a householder who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old.”
