


## The Psalms (sit)



Anglican chant composed by the English organist Henry John Gauntlett (1805-1876), who composed over 1,000 hymn tunes. His most famous tune is *Irby*, the tune to which we sing the Christmas carol *Once in royal David's city* (Hymn #102).

- 5 The heavens bear witness to your / wonders O / LORD, \* and to your faithfulness in the as / sembly / of the / holy ones;
- 6 For who in the skies can be com / pared to the / LORD? \* who is like the / LORD a / mong the / gods?
- 7 God is much to be feared in the / <u>council of the</u> / holy ones, \* great and terrible to / all those / round a / bout him.
- 8 Who is like you LORD / God of / hosts? \*
  O mighty LORD your / <u>faithfulness</u> is / all a / round you.
- 9 You rule the / <u>raging of the</u> / sea \* and still the / surging / of its / waves.
- 10 You have crushed Rahab of the deep with a / deadly / wound; \* you have scattered your enemies / with your / mighty / arm.
- 11 Yours are the heavens; the earth / <u>also</u> is / yours; \* you laid the foundations of the / world and / <u>all that</u> is / in it.
- 12 You have made the / north <u>and the</u> / south; \* Tabor and / <u>Hermon</u> re / <u>joice in</u> your / Name.
- 13 You have a / mighty / arm; \* strong is your / hand and / high is your / right hand.
- 14 Righteousness and justice are the foun / <u>dations of your</u> / throne; \* love and truth / go be / fore your / face.

- 15 Happy are the people who know the / festal / shout! \* they walk O / LORD in the / light of your / presence.
- 16 They rejoice / <u>daily in your</u> / Name; \* they are / <u>jubilant</u> / in your / righteousness.
- 17 For you are the / glory of their / strength, \* and by your / favor our / might is ex / alted.
- 18 Truly the / <u>LORD is</u> our / ruler; \*
  The Holy One of / Is<u>rael</u> / is our / King.



Anglican chant composed by Kellow John Pye (1812-1901), the first-ever student at the Royal Academy of Music in London. The Academy opened in 1823, and Pye was appointed Director in 1868.

- 44 You have put an / end to his / splendor \* and / cast his / throne to the / ground.

and the life everlasting. Amen.


