### The Invitatory and Psalter

*Officiant* O God, make speed to save us.

*Officiant and People*

### **O Gracious Light** *Phos hilaron*

O gracious Light,  
pure brightness of the everliving Father in heaven,  
O Jesus Christ, holy and blessed!

Now as we come to the setting of the sun,  
and our eyes behold the vesper light,  
we sing thy praises, O God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Thou art worthy at all times to be praised by happy voices,  
O Son of God, O Giver of life,  
and to be glorified through all the worlds.

### **Psalm 9** *Confitebor tibi*

- 1 I will give thanks to you, O LORD, with my whole heart; \*  
I will tell of all your marvelous works.
- 2 I will be glad and rejoice in you; \*  
I will sing to your Name, O Most High.
- 3 When my enemies are driven back, \*  
they will stumble and perish at your presence.
- 4 For you have maintained my right and my cause; \*  
you sit upon your throne judging right.
- 5 You have rebuked the ungodly and destroyed the wicked; \*  
you have blotted out their name for ever and ever.

- 6 As for the enemy, they are finished, in perpetual ruin, \*  
their cities plowed under, the memory of them perished;
- 7 But the LORD is enthroned for ever; \*  
he has set up this throne for judgment.
- 8 It is he who rules the world with righteousness; \*  
he judges the peoples with equity.
- 9 The LORD will be a refuge for the oppressed, \*  
a refuge in time of trouble.
- 10 Those who know your Name will put their trust in you, \*  
for you never forsake those who seek you, O LORD.
- 11 Sing praise to the LORD who dwells in Zion; \*  
proclaim to the peoples the things he has done.
- 12 The Avenger of blood will remember them; \*  
he will not forget the cry of the afflicted.
- 13 Have pity on me, O LORD; \*  
see the misery I suffer from those who hate me,  
O you who lift me up from the gate of death;
- 14 So that I may tell of all your praises  
and rejoice in your salvation \*  
in the gates of the city of Zion.
- 15 The ungodly have fallen into the pit they dug, \*  
and in the snare they set is their own foot caught.
- 16 The LORD is known by his acts of justice; \*  
the wicked are trapped in the works of their own hands.
- 17 The wicked shall be given over to the grave, \*  
and also all the people that forget God.
- 18 For the needy shall not always be forgotten, \*  
and the hope of the poor shall not perish for ever.

19 Rise up, O LORD, let not the ungodly have the upper hand; \*  
let them be judged before you.

20 Put fear upon them, O LORD; \*  
let the ungodly know they are but mortal.

**Psalm 15**     *Domine, quis habitabit?*

1 LORD, who may dwell in your tabernacle? \*  
who may abide upon your holy hill?

2 Whoever leads a blameless life and does what is right, \*  
who speaks the truth from his heart.

3 There is no guile upon his tongue;  
he does no evil to his friend; \*  
he does not heap contempt upon his neighbor.

4 In his sight the wicked is rejected, \*  
but he honors those who fear the LORD.

5 He has sworn to do no wrong \*  
and does not take back his word.

6 He does not give his money in hope of gain, \*  
nor does he take a bribe against the innocent.

7 Whoever does these things \*  
shall never be overthrown.

## The Lessons

*Officiant*      A Reading from the Book of Ecclesiasticus  
*Chapter 4 verse 20 through Chapter 5 verse 7*

- <sup>20</sup> Observe the right time, and beware of evil;  
and do not bring shame on yourself.
- <sup>21</sup> For there is a shame which brings sin,  
and there is a shame which is glory and favor.
- <sup>22</sup> Do not show partiality, to your own harm,  
or deference, to your downfall.
- <sup>23</sup> Do not refrain from speaking at the crucial time,<sup>[d]</sup>  
and do not hide your wisdom.<sup>[e]</sup>
- <sup>24</sup> For wisdom is known through speech,  
and education through the words of the tongue.
- <sup>25</sup> Never speak against the truth,  
but be mindful of your ignorance.
- <sup>26</sup> Do not be ashamed to confess your sins,  
and do not try to stop the current of a river.
- <sup>27</sup> Do not subject yourself to a foolish fellow,  
nor show partiality to a ruler.
- <sup>28</sup> Strive even to death for the truth  
and the Lord God will fight for you.
- <sup>29</sup> Do not be reckless in your speech,  
or sluggish and remiss in your deeds.
- <sup>30</sup> Do not be like a lion in your home,  
nor be a faultfinder with your servants.
- <sup>31</sup> Let not your hand be extended to receive,  
but withdrawn when it is time to repay.
- 5** Do not set your heart on your wealth,  
nor say, "I have enough."
- <sup>2</sup> Do not follow your inclination and strength,  
walking according to the desires of your heart.
- <sup>3</sup> Do not say, "Who will have power over me?"  
for the Lord will surely punish you.
- <sup>4</sup> Do not say, "I sinned, and what happened to me?"  
for the Lord is slow to anger.
- <sup>5</sup> Do not be so confident of atonement  
that you add sin to sin.
- <sup>6</sup> Do not say, "His mercy is great,  
he will forgive<sup>[a]</sup> the multitude of my sins,"

for both mercy and wrath are with him,  
and his anger rests on sinners.  
<sup>7</sup> Do not delay to turn to the Lord,  
nor postpone it from day to day;  
for suddenly the wrath of the Lord will go forth,  
and at the time of punishment you will perish.

**The Song of Mary**    *Magnificat*  
*Luke 1:46-55*

My soul doth magnify the Lord, \*  
and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior.

For he that is mighty hath magnified me, \*

<sup>51</sup> When the days drew near for him to be received up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem. <sup>52</sup> And he sent messengers ahead of him, who went and entered a village of the Samaritans, to make ready for him; <sup>53</sup> but the people would not receive him, because his

face was set toward Jerusalem. <sup>54</sup> And when his disciples James and John saw it, they said, "Lord, do you want us to bid fire come down from heaven and consume them?"<sup>[b]</sup> <sup>55</sup> But he turned and rebuked them.<sup>[c]</sup> <sup>56</sup> And they went on to another village. <sup>57</sup> As they were going along the road, a man said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go." <sup>58</sup> And Jesus said to him, "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of man has nowhere to lay his head." <sup>59</sup> To another he said, "Follow me." But he said, "Lord, let me first go and bury my father." <sup>60</sup> But he said to him, "Leave the dead to bury their own dead; but as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God." <sup>61</sup> Another said, "I will follow you, Lord; but let me first say farewell to those at my home." <sup>62</sup> Jesus said to him, "No one who puts his hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God."

A Collect for Mission on p. 70

O God and Father of all, whom the whole heavens adore:  
Let the whole earth also worship thee, all nations obey thee,  
all tongues confess and bless thee, and men and women everywhere  
love thee and serve thee in peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

A Collect for the Unity of the Human Family

O God, thou hast made us in thine own image and redeemed  
us through thy Son Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace:  
Give us grace seriously to lay to heart the great dangers  
we are in by our unhappy and unjust divisions; look with  
compassion on the whole human family; take away the  
arrogance and hatred which infect our hearts; break down  
the walls that separate us; and work through our struggles and  
confusion to accomplish thy purposes on earth; that we may  
be united in one holy bond of truth and justice, peace and love;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
