## The Invitatory and Psalter

*Officiant* O Lord, open thou our lips.

*People* And our mouth shall show forth thy praise.

*Officiant and People*

## **Venite** *Psalm 95:1-7*

O come, let us sing unto the Lord; \*

let us heartily rejoice in the strength of our salvation.

Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving \*

and show ourselves glad in him with psalms.

For the Lord is a great God, \*

and a great King above all gods.

In his hand are all the corners of the earth, \*

and the strength of the hills is his also.

The sea is his, and he made it, \*

and his hands prepared the dry land.

O come, let us worship and fall down, \*

and kneel before the Lord our Maker.

For he is the Lord our God, \*

and we are the people of his pasture

and the sheep of his hand.

O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness; \*

let the whole earth stand in awe of him.

For he cometh, for he cometh to judge the earth, \*

and with righteousness to judge the world

and the peoples with his truth.

## Psalm 78

### Part I *Attendite, popule*

- 1 Hear my teaching, O my people; \*  
incline your ears to the words of my mouth.
- 2 I will open my mouth in a parable; \*  
I will declare the mysteries of ancient times.
- 3 That which we have heard and known,  
and what our forefathers have told us, \*  
we will not hide from their children.
- 4 We will recount to generations to come  
the praiseworthy deeds and the power of the LORD, \*  
and the wonderful works he has done.
- 5 He gave his decrees to Jacob  
and established a law for Israel, \*  
which he commanded them to teach their children;
- 6 That the generations to come might know,  
and the children yet unborn; \*  
that they in their turn might tell it to their children;
- 7 So that they might put their trust in God, \*  
and not forget the deeds of God,  
but keep his commandments;
- 8 And not be like their forefathers,  
a stubborn and rebellious generation, \*  
a generation whose heart was not steadfast,  
and whose spirit was not faithful to God.
- 9 The people of Ephraim, armed with the bow, \*  
turned back in the day of battle;
- 10 They did not keep the covenant of God, \*  
and refused to walk in his law;

- 11 They forgot what he had done, \*  
and the wonders he had shown them.
- 12 He worked marvels in the sight of their forefathers, \*  
in the land of Egypt, in the field of Zoan.
- 13 He split open the sea and let them pass through; \*  
he made the waters stand up like walls.
- 14 He led them with a cloud by day, \*  
and all the night through with a glow of fire.
- 15 He split the hard rocks in the wilderness \*  
and gave them drink as from the great deep.
- 16 He brought streams out of the cliff, \*  
and the waters gushed out like rivers.
- 17 But they went on sinning against him, \*  
rebellng in the desert against the Most High.
- 18 They tested God in their hearts, \*  
demanding food for their craving.
- 19 They railed against God and said, \*  
"Can God set a table in the wilderness?"
- 20 True, he struck the rock, the waters gushed out, and the  
gullies overflowed; \*  
but is he able to give bread  
or to provide meat for his people?"
- 21 When the LORD heard this, he was full of wrath; \*  
a fire was kindled against Jacob,  
and his anger mounted against Israel;
- 22 For they had no faith in God, \*  
nor did they put their trust in his saving power.
- 23 So he commanded the clouds above \*  
and opened the doors of heaven.

- 24 He rained down manna upon them to eat \*  
and gave them grain from heaven.
- 25 So mortals ate the bread of angels; \*  
he provided for them food enough.
- 26 He caused the east wind to blow in the heavens \*  
and led out the south wind by his might.
- 27 He rained down flesh upon them like dust \*  
and wingèd birds like the sand of the sea.
- 28 He let it fall in the midst of their camp \*  
and round about their dwellings.
- 29 So they ate and were well filled, \*  
for he gave them what they craved.
- 30 But they did not stop their craving, \*  
though the food was still in their mouths.
- 31 So God's anger mounted against them; \*  
he slew their strongest men  
and laid low the youth of Israel.
- 32 In spite of all this, they went on sinning \*  
and had no faith in his wonderful works.
- 33 So he brought their days to an end like a breath \*  
and their years in sudden terror.
- 34 Whenever he slew them, they would seek him, \*  
and repent, and diligently search for God.
- 35 They would remember that God was their rock, \*  
and the Most High God their redeemer.
- 36 But they flattered him with their mouths \*  
and lied to him with their tongues.

37 Their heart was not steadfast toward him, \*  
and they were not faithful to his covenant.

38 But he was so merciful that he forgave their sins  
and did not destroy them; \*  
many times he held back his anger  
and did not permit his wrath to be roused.

39 For he remembered that they were but flesh, \*  
a breath that goes forth and does not return.

*Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: \*  
As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.*

## The Lesson

*Officiant* A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles  
*Chapter 18 verses 12 through 28*

<sup>12</sup> But when Gallio was proconsul of Acha'ia, the Jews made a united attack upon Paul and brought him before the tribunal, <sup>13</sup> saying, "This man is persuading men to worship God contrary to the law." <sup>14</sup> But when Paul was about to open his mouth, Gallio said to the Jews, "If it were a matter of wrongdoing or vicious crime, I should have reason to bear with you, O Jews; <sup>15</sup> but since it is a matter of questions about words and names and your own law, see to it yourselves; I refuse to be a judge of these things." <sup>16</sup> And he drove them from the tribunal. <sup>17</sup> And they all seized Sos'thenes, the ruler of the synagogue, and beat him in front of the tribunal. But Gallio paid no attention to this.

<sup>18</sup> After this Paul stayed many days longer, and then took leave of the brethren and sailed for Syria, and with him Priscilla and Aq'uila. At Cen'chre-ae he cut his hair, for he had a vow. <sup>19</sup> And they came to Ephesus, and he left them there; but he himself went into the synagogue and argued with the Jews. <sup>20</sup> When they asked him to stay for a longer period, he declined; <sup>21</sup> but on taking leave of them he said, "I will return to you if God wills," and he set sail from Ephesus.

<sup>22</sup> When he had landed at Caesare'a, he went up and greeted the church, and then went down to Antioch. <sup>23</sup> After spending some time there he departed and went from place to place through the region of Galatia and Phryg'ia, strengthening all the disciples.

<sup>24</sup> Now a Jew named Apol'los, a native of Alexandria, came to Ephesus. He was an eloquent man, well versed in the scriptures. <sup>25</sup> He had been instructed in the way of the

Lord; and being fervent in spirit, he spoke and taught accurately the things concerning Jesus, though he knew only the baptism of John. <sup>26</sup> He began to speak boldly in the synagogue; but when Priscilla and Aq'uila heard him, they took him and expounded to him the way of God more accurately. <sup>27</sup> And when he wished to cross to Acha'ia, the brethren encouraged him, and wrote to the disciples to receive him. When he arrived, he greatly helped those who through grace had believed, <sup>28</sup> for he powerfully confuted the Jews in public, showing by the scriptures that the Christ was Jesus.

whereby the dayspring from on high hath visited us;  
To give light to them that sit in darkness  
and in the shadow of death, \*  
and to guide our feet into the way of peace.
