



Psalm 141

Domine, clamabi



- 1 O LORD, I call to you; come to me quickly;* hear my voice when I cry to you.
- 2 Let my prayer be set forth in your sight as **in**cense,* the lifting up of my hands as the **evening sacri**fice.
- 3 Set a watch before my mouth, O LORD, and guard the door of my lips;* let not my heart incline to any evil thing.
- 4 Let me not be occupied in wickedness with evildoers,* nor eat of their choice foods.
- 5 Let the righteous smite me in friendly rebuke; let not the oil of the unrighteous anoint my **head**;* for my prayer is continually against their wicked *deeds*.
- 6 Let their rulers be overthrown in stony **places**,* that they may **know** my **words** are *true*.
- 7 As when a plowman turns over the earth in **furrows**,* let their bones be scattered at the **mouth** of **the** *grave*.
- 8 But my eyes are turned to you, Lord **God**;* in you I take refuge; do not **strip** me **of** my *life*.
- 9 Protect me from the snare which they have **laid** for me* and from the traps of the evildoers.
- 10 Let the wicked fall into their own nets,* while I myself escape.


Hoce mea ad Dominum




- 1 I cry to the LORD with my voice;* to the LORD I make loud supplication.

The First Lesson, 1 Samuel 10:1-16 (sit)

Revised Standard Version

Samuel took a vial of oil and poured it on his head, and kissed Saul and said, "Has not the Lord anointed you to be prince over his people Israel? And you shall reign over the people of the Lord and you will save them from the hand of their enemies round about. And this shall be the sign to you that the Lord has anointed you to be prince over his heritage. When you depart from me today you will meet two men by Rachel's tomb in the territory of Benjamin at Zelzah, and they will say to you, 'The asses which you went to seek are found, and now your father has ceased to care about the asses and is anxious about you, saying, "What shall I do about my son?" Then you shall go on from there further and come to the oak of Tabor; three men going up to God at Bethel will meet you there, one carrying three kids, another carrying three loaves of bread, and another carrying a skin of wine. And they will greet you and give you two loaves of bread, which you shall accept from their hand. After that you shall come to Gib'eath-elo'him, where there is a garrison of the Philistines; and there, as you come to the city, you will meet a band of prophets coming down from the high place with harp, tambourine, flute, and lyre before them, prophesying. Then the spirit of the Lord will come mightily upon you, and you shall prophesy with them and be turned into another man. Now when these signs meet you, do whatever your hand finds to do, for God is with you. And you shall go down before me to Gilgal; and behold, I am coming to you to offer burnt offerings and to sacrifice peace offerings. Seven days you shall wait, until I come to you and show you what you shall do." When he turned his back to leave Samuel, God gave him another heart; and all these signs came to pass that day. When they came to Gib'e-ah, behold, a band of prophets met him; and the spirit of God came mightily upon him, and he prophesied among them. And when all who knew him before saw how he prophesied with the prophets, the people said to one another, "What has come over the son of Kish? Is Saul also among the prophets?" And a man of the place answered, "And who is their father?" Therefore it became a proverb, "Is Saul also among the prophets?" When he had finished prophesying, he came to the high place. Saul's uncle said to him and to his servant, "Where did you go?" And he said, "To seek the asses; and when we saw they were not to be found, we went to Samuel." And Saul's uncle said, "Pray, tell me what Samuel said to you." And Saul said to his uncle, "He told us plainly that the asses had been found." But about the matter of the kingdom, of which Samuel had spoken, he did not tell him anything.


The Second Lesson, Matthew 21:23-32 (sit)

When Jesus entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came up to him as he was teaching, and said, "By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?" Jesus answered them, "I also will ask you a question; and if you tell me the answer, then I also will tell you by what authority I do these things. The baptism of John, whence was it? From heaven or from men?" And they argued with one another, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say to us, 'Why then did you not believe him?' But if we say, 'From men,' we are afraid of the multitude; for all hold that John was a prophet." So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And he said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I do these things. "What do you think? A man had two sons; and he went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.' And he answered, 'I will not'; but afterward he repented and went. And he went to the second and said the same; and he answered, 'I go, sir,' but did not go. Which of the two did the will of his father?" They said, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Truly, I say to you, the tax collectors and the harlots go into the kingdom of God before you. For John came to you in the way of righteousness, and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the harlots believed him; and even when you saw it, you did not afterward repent and believe him."




