





# Psalm 106 Confitemini Domino John Randall



John Randall (1716-1799) was an English organist and academic. He worked at the University of Cambridge, first as the organist of King's College, and later as Professor of Music. The memorial where he is buried in Cambridge has the inscription The sweetness of his harmonies charmed the ear, and the mildness of his manners the heart.

- 1 Hallelujah! Give thanks to the LORD for / he is / good, \* for his / mercy en - / dures for / ever.
- 2 Who can declare the mighty / acts of the / LORD \* or / show forth / all his / praise?
- 3 Happy are those who / act with / justice \* and / always / do what is / right!
- 4 Remember me O LORD with the favor you / have for your / people, \* and visit me / with your / saving / help;
- 5 That I may see the prosperity of your elect, and be glad with the / gladness of your / people, that I may / glory with / your in - / heritance.
- 6 We have sinned as our / forebears / did; \* we have done / wrong and / dealt / wickedly.
- 7 In Egypt they did not consider your marvelous works, nor remember the a - / bundance of your / love; \* they defied the Most / High at the / Red / Sea.
- 8 But he saved them for his / Name's / sake, \* to / make his / power / known.
- 9 He rebuked the Red Sea and it / **dried** / up, \* and he led them through the / deep as / through a / desert.
- 10 He saved them from the hand of / those who / hated them \* and re - / deemed them from the / hand of the / enemy.
- 11 The waters / covered their op / pressors; \* not / one of / them was / left.
- 12 Then they be / lieved his / words \* and / sang him / songs of / praise.

- 13 But they soon for / got his / deeds \* and / did not / wait for his / counsel.
- 14 A craving / <u>seized them in the</u> / wilderness, \* and they put / God to the / test in the / desert.
- 15 He / gave them what they / asked, \* but sent / leanness / into their / soul.
- 16 They envied / Moses in the / camp, \* and Aaron the / holy / one of the / LORD.
- 17 The earth opened and / swallowed / Dathan \* and / covered the / company of A / biram.
- 18 Fire blazed up a / gainst their / company, \* and / flames de / voured the / wicked.
- 19 Israel made a / <u>bull-calf</u> at / Horeb \* and / worshiped a / molten / image;
- 20 And so they ex / changed their / Glory \* for the image of an / ox that / feeds on / grass.
- 21 They forgot / God their / Savior, \* who had done / **great** / things in / Egypt,
- 22 Wonderful deeds in the / land of / Ham, \* and fearful / things at the / **Red** / **Sea**.
- 23 So he would have destroyed them, had not Moses his chosen stood be - / <u>fore him in the</u> / breach, \* to turn a - / way his / wrath from con - / suming them.
- 24 They refused the / pleasant / land \* and / would not be / lieve his / promise.
- 25 They / grumbled in their / tents \* and would not / listen to the / voice of the / LORD.



- 26 So he lifted his / hand a / gainst them, \* to over / throw them / in the / wilderness,
- 27 To cast out their / seed a-mong the / nations, \* and to / scatter them through / out the / lands.
- 28 They joined themselves to / **Baal** / Peor \* and ate sacrifices / offered / to the / dead.
- 29 They provoked him to / <u>anger with their</u> / actions, \* and a / plague broke / out a / mong them.
- 30 Then Phinehas stood up and / inter / ceded, \* and the / **plague** / came to an / end.
- 31 This was reckoned to / him as / righteousness \* throughout / all gene / rations for / ever.
- 32 Again they provoked his anger at the / waters of / Meribah, \* so that he / punished / Moses be / cause of them;
- 33 For they so em / <u>bittered</u> his / spirit \* that he spoke / **rash** / words <u>with his</u> / lips.
- 34 They did not de / stroy the / peoples \* -- / as the / LORD <u>had com</u> / manded them.
- 35 They inter / mingled with the / heathen \* and / learned their / pagan / ways,
- 36 So that they / worshiped their / idols, \*
  -- / which be / came a / snare to them.
- 37 They / <u>sacrificed</u> their / sons \* and their / <u>daughters</u> to / evil / spirits.
- 38 They shed innocent blood, the blood of their / sons and / daughters, \* which they offered to the idols of Canaan, and the / land was de / filed with / blood.
- 39 Thus they were pol / <u>luted by their</u> / actions \* and went / <u>whoring in their</u> / evil / deeds.
- 40 Therefore the wrath of the LORD was kindled a / gainst his / people \* and / he ab / horred his in / heritance.



- 41 He gave them over to the / <u>hand of</u> the / heathen, \* and those who / hated / them ruled / over them.
- 42 Their / <u>enemies</u> op / pressed them, \* and they were / humbled / <u>under</u> their / hand.
- 43 Many a time did he deliver them, but they rebelled through their / own de / vices, \* and were brought / down in / their in / iquity.
- 44 Nevertheless he / saw their dis / tress, \* when he / heard their / lamen / tation.
- 45 He remembered his / <u>covenant</u> with / them \* and relented in ac / <u>cordance</u> with / his great / mercy.
- 46 He / <u>caused them to be</u> / pitied \* by / those who / held them / captive.



Your words have upheld him who was stumbling, and you have made firm the feeble knees. But now it has come to you, and you are impatient; it touches you, and you are dismayed. Is not your fear of God your confidence, and the integrity of your ways your hope? Now a word was brought to me stealthily, my ear received the whisper of it. Amid thoughts from visions of the night, when deep sleep falls on men, dread came upon me, and trembling, which made all my bones shake. A spirit glided past my face; the hair of my flesh stood up. It stood still, but I could not discern its appearance. A form was before my eyes; there was silence, then I heard a voice: 'Can mortal man be righteous before God? Can a man be pure before his Maker? Even in his servants he puts no trust, and his angels he charges with error; how much more those who dwell in houses of clay, whose foundation is in the dust, who are crushed before the moth. Between morning and evening they are destroyed; they perish for ever without any regarding it. If their tent-cord is plucked up within them, do they not die, and that without wisdom?'"






