- 9 Do to them as you did to Midian, * to Sisera, and to Jabin at the river of Kishon:

- 11 Make their leaders like Oreb and Zeëb, * and all their commanders like Zebah and Zalmunna,
- 12 Who said, "Let us take for ourselves * the fields of God as our possession."
- 13 O my God, make them like whirling dust * and like chaff before the wind:
- 14 Like fire that burns down a forest, * like the flame that sets mountains ablaze.

- 15 Drive them with your tempest * and terrify them with your storm;
- 16 Cover their faces with shame, O LORD, * that they may seek your Name.
- 17 Let them be disgraced and terrified for ever; * let them be put to confusion and perish.
- 18 Let them know that you, whose Name is YAHWEH, * you alone are the Most High over all the earth.

The Lesson

Officiant A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles
Chapter 19 verses 11 through 20

God did extraordinary miracles by the hands of Paul, so that handkerchiefs or aprons were carried away from his body to the sick, and diseases left them and the evil spirits came out of them. Then some of the itinerant Jewish exorcists undertook to pronounce the name of the Lord Jesus over those who had evil spirits, saying, "I adjure you by the Jesus whom Paul preaches." Seven sons of a Jewish high priest named Sceva were doing this. But the evil spirit answered them, "Jesus I know, and Paul I know; but who are you?" And the man in whom the evil spirit was leaped on them, mastered all of them, and overpowered them, so that they fled out of that house naked and wounded. And this became known to all residents of Ephesus, both Jews and Greeks; and fear fell upon them all; and the name of the Lord Jesus was extolled. Many also of those who were now believers came, confessing and divulging their practices. And a number of those who practiced magic arts brought their books together and burned them in the sight of all; and they counted the value of them and found it came to fifty thousand pieces of silver. So the word of the Lord grew and prevailed mightily.
