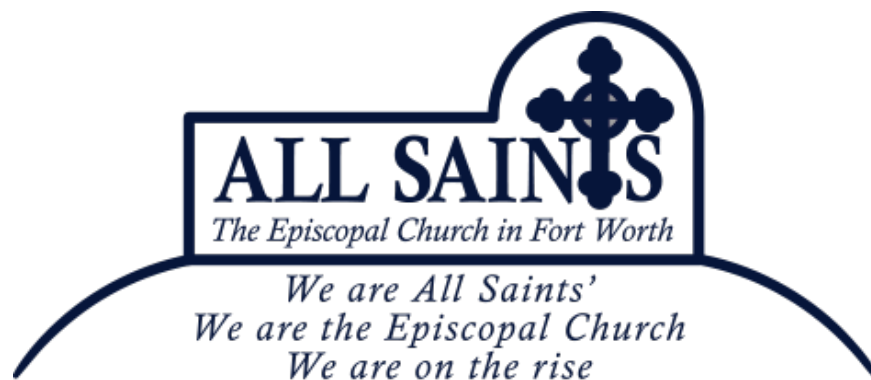

Psalm 32

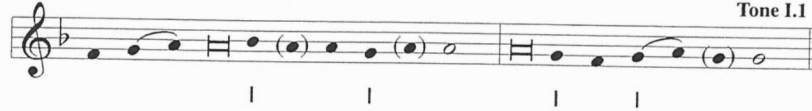
Beati quorum



- 1 Happy are they whose transgressions are **forgiven**,*
and whose **sin is put** away!
- 2 Happy are they to whom the LORD **imputes no guilt**,*
and in whose spirit **there is no** guile!
- 3 While I held my tongue, my bones withered **away**,*
because of my **groaning all** day long.
- 4 For your hand was heavy upon **me day and night**;*
my moisture was dried up as in the **heat of summer**.
- 5 Then I acknowledged **my sin to you**,*
and did **not conceal** my guilt.
- 6 I said, "I will confess my transgressions to **the LORD**."*
Then you forgave me **the guilt of my sin**.
- 7 Therefore all the faithful will make their prayers to you in time **of trouble**;*
when the great waters overflow, they **shall not reach** them.
- 8 You are my hiding-place; you preserve me **from trouble**;*

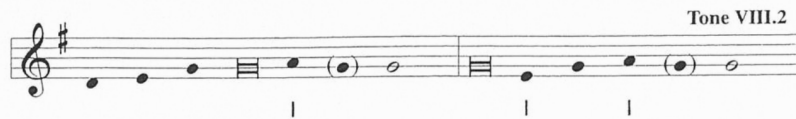


- 1 Rejoice in the **LORD**, you **righteous**;*
it is good for the just to sing *praises*.
- 2 Praise the **LORD** with **the** harp;*
play to him upon the psaltery *and* lyre.
- 3 Sing for **him** a **new** song;*
sound a fanfare with all your skill upon the *trumpet*.
- 4 For the **word** of the **LORD** is right,*
and **all** his *works* are sure.
- 5 He loves righteousness and **justice**;*
the loving-kindness of the **LORD** fills the *whole* earth.
- 6 By the word of the **LORD** **were** the **heavens** made,*
by the breath of his mouth all the **heavenly** hosts.
- 7 He gathers up the waters of the ocean as **in** a **water-skin***
and stores up the **depths** of *the* sea.
- 8 Let all the **earth** fear **the** **LORD**;*
let all who dwell in the world **stand** in *awe* of him.
- 9 For he **spoke**, and it **came** to pass;*
he commanded, **and** it *stood* fast.
- 10 The **LORD** brings the will of the **nations** to naught;*
he thwarts the designs **of** the *peoples*.
- 11 But the **LORD**'s will stands **fast** for **ever**,*
and the designs of his **heart** from *age* to age.
- 12 Happy is the nation whose **God** is **the** **LORD**!*
happy the people he has chosen to *be* his own!
- 13 The **LORD** looks **down** from **heaven**,*
and beholds all the **people** *in* the world.
- 14 From where he sits **enthroned** he **turns** his gaze*
on all who **dwell** on *the* earth.
- 15 He fashions **all** the **hearts** of them*
and **understands** all *their* works.
- 16 There is no king that can be saved by a **mighty** **army**;*
a strong man is not delivered **by** his *great* strength.
- 17 The horse is a vain hope **for** deliverance;*
for all its **strength** it *cannot* save.

- 18 Behold, the eye of the LORD is upon **those** who **fear** him,*
on those who **wait upon** his love,
- 19 To **pluck** their **lives** from death,*
and to feed them in **time** of *famine*.
- 20 Our **soul** waits **for** the LORD;*
he is our **help** and *our* shield.
- 21 Indeed, our heart **rejoices in** him,*
for in his holy **Name** we *put* our trust.

and will save those whose **spirits are** crushed.
- 19 Many are the troubles of the **righteous**,*
but the LORD will deliver **him out of** them all.
- 20 He will keep safe all his **bones**;*
not one of them **shall be broken**.
- 21 Evil shall slay the **wicked**,*
and those who hate the righteous **will be punished**.
- 22 The LORD ransoms the life of his **servants**,*
and none will be **punished** who **trust** in him.

I turned my face to the Lord God, seeking him by prayer and supplications with fasting and sackcloth and ashes. Jesus cried out and said, "He who believes in me, believes not in me but in him who sent me. And he who sees me sees him who sent me. I have come as light into the world, that whoever believes in me may not remain in darkness. If any one hears my sayings and does not keep them, I do not judge him; for I did not come to judge the world but to save the world. He who rejects me and does not receive my sayings has a judge; the word that I have spoken will be his judge on the last day. For I have not spoken on my own authority; the Father who sent me has himself given me commandment what to say and what to speak. And I know that his commandment is eternal life. The Collect of the Day (*stand*)

Ludovico Viadana

Exsultate justi in Domino, rectos decet collaudatio. Confitemini Domino in cithara, in psalterio decem chordarum. Psallite illi, cantate ei, canticum novum, bene psallite ei in vociferatione.

*Praise your God, ye righteous, rejoice and sing, for the Lord is worthy to be praised.
Raise your voices and sound his praise with lute and harp. Strike the ten-stringed psaltery bravely. Tell out his praises, declare his glory, sing ye a new song. O sing praises, sing lustily with good courage.*

Music composed by Ludovico Viadana (1560-1627), an Italian composer, teacher, and Franciscan friar of the Order of Friars Minor Observants. He held a succession of posts as Choirmaster at various cathedrals in Italy, including the Cathedral of San Luca in Mantua.
