- Rejoice in the LORD, you righteous;* it is good for the just to sing praises.
- 2 Praise the LORD with the harp;* play to him upon the psaltery *and* lyre.
- 3 Sing for him a new song;* sound a fanfare with all your skill upon the *trum*pet.
- 4 For the word of the LORD is right,* and all his *works* are sure.
- 5 He loves righteous**ness** and **jus**tice;* the loving-kindness of the LORD **fills** the *whole* earth.
- 6 By the word of the LORD were the heavens made,* by the breath of his mouth all the heaven*ly* hosts.
- 7 He gathers up the waters of the ocean as in a water-skin* and stores up the **depths** of *the* sea.
- 8 Let all the **earth** fear **the** LORD;* let all who dwell in the world **stand** in *awe* of him.
- 9 For he spoke, and it came to pass;* he commanded, and it stood fast.
- 10 The LORD brings the will of the nations to naught;* he thwarts the designs of the peoples.
- 11 But the LORD's will stands **fast** for **eve**,* and the designs of his **heart** from *age* to age.
- 12 Happy is the nation whose **God** is **the** LORD!* happy the people he has chosen to *be* his own!
- 13 The LORD looks **down** from **heaven**,* and beholds all the **people** *in* the world.
- 14 From where he sits enthroned he turns his gaze* on all who dwell on *the* earth.
- 15 He fashions **all** the **hearts** of them* and understands all *their* works.
- 16 There is no king that can be saved by a **mighty army**;* a strong man is not delivered **by** his *great* strength.
- 17 The horse is a vain hope **for** deliverance;* for all its **strength** it *can*not save.

- 18 Behold, the eye of the LORD is upon those who fear him,* on those who wait upon his love,
- 19 To **pluck** their **lives** from death,* and to feed them in **time** of *fa*mine.
- 20 Our **soul** waits **for** the LORD;* he is our **help** and *our* shield.
- 21 Indeed, our heart rejoices in him,* for in his holy Name we *put* our trust.
- 22 Let your loving-kindness, O LORD, **be** up**on** us,* as we have **put** our *trust* in you.

- 14 Turn from evil and do **good**;* seek peace **and** pursue it.
- 15 The eyes of the LORD are upon the **righ**teous,* and his ears are **o**pen **to** their cry.
- 16 The face of the LORD is against those who do evil,* to root out the remembrance of them from the earth.
- 17 The righteous cry, and the LORD hears them* and delivers them from all their troubles.
- 18 The LORD is near to the brokenhearted* and will save those whose **spi**rits **are** crushed.
- 19 Many are the troubles of the righteous,* but the LORD will deliver him out of them all.
- 20 He will keep safe all his **bones**;* not one of them **shall** be **bro**ken.
- 21 Evil shall slay the **wick**ed,* and those who hate the righteous **will** be **pun**ished.
- 22 The LORD ransoms the life of his **ser**vants,* and none will be pun**ished** who **trust** in him.





Jesus cried out and said, "He who believes in me, believes not in me but in him who sent me. And he who sees me sees him who sent me. I have come as light into the world, that whoever believes in me may not remain in darkness. If any one hears my sayings and does not keep them, I do not judge him; for I did not come to judge the world but to save the world. He who rejects me and does not receive my sayings has a judge; the word that I have spoken will be his judge on the last day. For I have not spoken on my own authority; the Father who sent me has himself given me commandment what to say and what to speak. And I know that his commandment is eternal life. 


